### **Background Information:**

**History:** In lieu of an over-arching collection history, separate histories have been compiled for each club or organization and are included under the appropriate series records below.

Scope and Content Arrangement: The Joliet Area Clubs and Organizations Collection contains organizational records, scrapbooks, meeting minutes, yearbooks, event programing, photographs, newspaper articles, and other materials relating to the history of clubs in Joliet. The collection is divided into 13 series based on club or organization and the series have been arranged alphabetically. Series 12 is excluded from this organization pattern. Series 12 contains a variety of different organizations. None of these organizations contained enough materials to warrant an individualized series within this collection.

Series 1, Series 5, Series 7 and Series 10 have further been arranged into sub-series. The sub-series create a logical distinction between document types in relation to each organization.

Series 1: American Association of University Women (AAUW), 1947-1987

Location: RR.9.4

Scope: This series contains branch reports, charters, program information, conference records, meeting minutes, and additional information regarding the history of the Joliet Branch of the American Association of University Women (AAUW). The AAUW was founded in Boston, MA in 1881. Marion Talbot and Ellen Swallow Richards met with 15 other alumnae from eight colleges to discuss the need for college-educated women to have greater opportunities and for more women to have access to higher education. By 1882 the original 17 women were joined by 50 other alumnae to officially launch the American Collegiate Association, which ultimately became the American Association of University Women. The Joliet Branch of the AAUW was organized in 1934.

The organization's main goal is "to band together teenage girls for spiritual and moral up-

building: to inspire the desire for knowledge, to teach love of country and flag, love of home, respect for parents and elders and reverence for the Holy Scriptures – the principles for which Freemasonry stand."

**Series 6:** Joliet Hospitality Club, 1948-2003

Location: RR.9.4

**Scope:** This series contains meeting minutes, and other organizational records from the Joliet Newcomer's Alumnae Club, later to be renamed the Joliet Hospitality Club. The first meeting of the Joliet Newcomer's Alumnae Club was held on June 24, 1948, in the McCulloch Tea Rooms with 35 members present. Mrs. Harold Hensler and Mrs. G. Wayne Churchill founded the organization as a way to maintain friendships previously established in the earlier Newcomer's Club. The club was marked

from the beginning as a purely social organization, while still supporting the charity efforts of the Newcomer's Club. As the organization grew membership had grown beyond alumni of the Newcomer's Club. The board voted to rename the group the Joliet Hospitality Club in June of 1978 to reflect this change in membership.

The Kiwanis Club began as an organization formed in Detroit, Michigan in 1915. The first convention was held in Cleveland, Ohio in 1916 and it was here that the name "The Kiwanis Club" was selected. The Joliet Kiwanis Club was chartered in April of 1920 with 44 charter members. BY 1934 the Joliet club produced the first Annual Kiwanis Show, identifying the organization in the community.

Series 10: Women's Club of Joliet, 1916-1971

**Location:** RR.6.1, RR.6.2

**Scope:** The Women's Club of Joliet was founded in March of 1915, as an auxiliary of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, the Illinois Federation of Women's Club, and the 11<sup>th</sup> District Federation of Women's Clubs. Ida Staehle was instrumental in the creation of the organization and was voted the club's founding President along with First Vice President Mary Dougall Barr, Second Vice President Della Spangler Barber and Secretaries Ella Wilson and Edna Strohm. The organization sought civic betterment in the community and formed a series of committees and departments within the organization to fulfill their purpose. These committees included; Membership, Program, Press, Hospitality, Literature, Music, Social Service and Art.

This series includes materials from the Women's Club of Joliet such as yearbooks, meeting minutes, newspaper articles, scrapbooks and photographs. Many of the scrapbooks included materials that had been folded into envelopes, or materials that have come loose from the pages. These items have been removed from the scrapbooks for preservation purposes and are included as loose scrapbook materials.

Series 11: Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA), 1859-1991

Location: RR.6.2

Scope: This series contains materials relating to the history of the Young Men's Christian Association in Joliet including meeting minutes, programs, publications, and newspaper articles. The Young Men's Christian Association, better known as the YMCA, was originally founded by George Williams in London in 1844. The YMCA aimed to put Christian values into practice, and offer a a supportive community to help young men address pressing social challenges. The organization quickly grew internationally, due in large part to the first World's Fair, the Great Exhibition of 1851. The Joliet YMCA was founded in April of 1882 on Clinton St. Due to financial struggles the organization closed in 1901. Plans for a new YMCA location in Joliet began again in the 1920s. A fundraising campaign raised \$450,000 to cover the building expenses in addition to a \$200,000 donation from the United States Steel Corporation. The new Joliet YMCA opened on September 30, 1928.
