Background Information:

History:

Joliet is known as the City of Steel and Stone, a slogan dating back to the 19th century. Rich deposits of limestone led to a thriving quarrying industry, and in the years that followed the Civil War, a huge iron and steel producing industry emerged in the city. Thousands of European immigrants would find their way to Joliet to work low-paying, dangerous jobs at the Steel Mills, beginning with the construction of the Union Coal, Iron and Transportation Company located on Collins St. in 1869. The location of the plant was most likely selected in part for its proximity to the I&M Canal, but railroad lines were later extended to the site, providing immediate access to an additional transportation system.

In 1873 the company reorganized as the Joliet Iron and Steel Company, and in 1879 became known as just the Joliet Steel Company. Joliet Steel became part of the Illinois Steel Company in 1889, concluding the conversion of the site from iron to steel production only. The company operated as a Bessemer

plant, a process popularized in the States in the 1880s which made it possible to manufacture large quantities of steel at one time. The Bessemer process was particularly well-suited to making rails.

Over the years the production of steel in Joliet also attracted wire companies to the area such as the American Steel and Wire Company and the Illinois Wire Manufacturing Company. The growing demand for barbed wire in western states boosted the sale of steel to Joliet firms.

When United States Steel Corporation was formed in 1901, it brought under one corporate umbrella the Illinois Steel Company on Collins St and the American Steel and Wire Company on Scott St. and in Rockdale. After additional name and organization changes, local operations were absorbed into the parent corporation in 1963 and became known as the Joliet Works of United States Steel Corporation.

Scope and Content Arrangement:

The Joliet Steel Companies Collection contains correspondence, company publications, invoices, registration records, and photographs pertaining to the history of various steel and wire manufacturing companies in Joliet. The collection has been arranged into 3 series based on the document type and the materials in each series are arranged chronologically. There are several oversized photographs included in the collection. All oversized materials are listed in Series 3 of the collection and are recorded in the finding aid with their original series number as well. Oversized materials are housed in oversize storage drawer 5 in the Curator's Office.
