Series 1: Baptist Churches, 1916-1927, 1953, 2009

Location: RR.5.3

Scope: The first Baptist organization in the Joliet area was organized in 1837 by Elder Ashley, and meetings were held by Rev. Solomon Knapp at the Broadway School. By 1853 a council formed for the purpose of reorganization, and it was determined that a dedicated church was needed. The first Baptist church was erected at the corner of Scott and Van Buren Streets but sold the property in 1902 to become St. Anthony's Catholic Church. Prior to the sale in 1890 the Baptist church split, forming the Eastern Avenue Baptist Church at Van Buren and Eastern Ave., and the First Baptist Church at the corner of Baker and Second Ave.

Series 2: Catholic Churches, 1879, 1902, 1916-2010

Location: RR.5.3

Scope: St. Patrick's was established in 1838 under Father Plunkett, a missionary who arrived in the area during the construction of the canal. In 1842 the congregation constructed a large stone church at the corner of Broadway and Jefferson Streets, the oldest Catholic Church in Joliet. The congregation was primarily made up of Irish, German and French canal workers. In 1918 the congregation separated to form St. Patrick's and St. Raymond's, both constructing new churches and the original structure was demolished in 1925.

Catholicism quickly grew in Joliet and the Diocese of Joliet was decreed in 1948 and established in 1949 under Bishop Martin D. McNamara . The Diocese is made up of seven counties including: DuPage, Kendall, Will, Grundy, Kankakee, Iroquois and Ford. The Church of St Raymond was named the Cathedral of the Diocese, but the building was inadequate to meet the requirements of a Cathedral and in 1950 fundraising began for a new structure. By December of 1954 the new Cathedral held its first mass with over 2,000 in attendance. The Cathedral was formally dedicated on May 26, 1955.

Series 3: Episcopal Churches, 1912-1935, 1981, 1992

Location: RR.5.3

Scope: Christ Church was founded in 1835 under Bishop Chace. In the 1880s the organization commissioned Joliet architect F.S. Allen to design and build a church on Van Buren St. The church was designed in the gothic revival style and built from Joliet limestone.

Series 4: Jewish Congregations, 1941-1945, 1989, 1995

Location: RR.5.3

Scope: Jewish families began to settle in Joliet in the early 1860s and by 1900 there were 65 Jewish families living in the Joliet area. Two Jewish congregations were in place by December of 1902: the Jewish Congregation of Joliet (later known as B'nai B'rith) and the Hebrew Protective Association of Joliet. In 1927, Orthodox, Conservative and Reformed Jewish factions in Joliet formed a single congregation, meeting in the basement in a house at 114 East Clinton. A temple was erected at Eastern and Clinton Ave in 1928, later to be replaced by the Midland Avenue Temple in 1968.

Series 6: Methodist Churches, 1921-1996, 2000

Location: RR.5.3, RR.5.4

Scope: The first Methodist congregation in Joliet was formed in the early 1830s under Reverend Jesse Walker. Services were originally held outdoors or in the homes of the first settlers. Once Fort Nonsense was built in 1832, the congregation would meet there for sermons. The Methodist congregation is the oldest in Joliet, and also established the first physical church in the city; a small one room building located on the corner of Washington and Ottawa Street in 1837. In 1859 the property caught fire, and a new structure was built in its place. By 1909 the Methodist congregation sold the property and relocated to a new church on the corner of Ottawa and Cass Streets, the Ottawa Street Methodist Church. The Church remained active until its closing in 1991, at which time the congregation merged with Grace Methodist Church.

Series 7: Orthodox Churches, 1962-1991

Location: RR.5.4

Scope: Beginning in the early 1900's immigrants from Greece began to arrive in the Joliet area, many settled in the Bluff area along Broadway. Greek, Russian, and Serbian immigrants began worshiping as an Orthodox congregation together. By 1916 the Greeks separated themselves through the formation of the All Saints Greek Orthodox Church, using a remodeled brick home as their church until the present-day church on Broadway Ave. was built in 1943. In 1927 the Serbian Orthodox community separated through the formation of the St. George Serbian Church on Scott and Ohio Streets. They would later relocate to a church on Stryker Avenue. The remaining congregation formed the St. Nicholas Orthodox Catholic Church located on Barber Lane.

Series 8: Presbyterian Churches, 1898, 1904, 1925-1944, 2008

Location: RR.5.4

Scope: The first Presbyterian congregation was organized in Joliet in 1835 under Rev. J.H. Prentiss and Rev. Kirby. In 1844 Rev. Benj. W. Dwight reorganized the group as the Central Presbyterian congregation. For a time they held service in the third story of a building on Merchant's Row, then in the Will County Courthouse, and finally in the Universalist Church on Clinton Avenue. By 1850 the Central Presbyterian congregation built their own church on Ottawa Street.

The First Presbyterian Church was organized in 1866 under Rev. O.A. Kingsbury. They built their first church shortly after at the corner of Broadway and Western Avenue.

Series 9: Universalist, 1914-1936, 1951

Location: RR.5.4

Scope: The Universalist Unitarian Church began in Joliet in 1836 under the name St. John's Universalist Church. By 1856 the organization built their first church at the corner of Clinton and Chicago Streets. By 1870 their membership began to decline, in an effort to reestablish themselves the congregation demolished their current church and built the Auditorium Building in 1891. The second floor of the building housed the Universalist Church, while the remaining floors were used as a meeting place for civic organization, shops were located on the street level, and the Joliet Music College resided on the third floor. It is considered one of the first cultural arts centers in Will County. The congregation closed the downtown building in the 1980s and relocated to West Jefferson St. in the early 2000s.
